## EDP Course Planner

- Complete the entire column, by selecting 15 courses + alternates. **Carefully review selections at home with a parent or guardian and submit selections when your high school high school counselor comes to your middle school.**
  - If you have a **blue dot** on a course, read the warning to understand what is required in order to select this course.
  - If you have a **red dot** on a selected course, read the alert. You will not be able to submit your selections with any red dots

## Course Planner continued

- **You are required to submit the course requests when your high school counselor visits your middle school**
- You won't be allowed to hit the **SUBMIT** button to lock your course selections until your counselor checks your course selections.
- Print out a Course Request Authorization Sheet
- Student and Parent/Guardian signatures are required on the last page
- Return signed Authorization Sheet to the Counseling Office in your Middle School.

## English Options

- **English 9**
  - This is the English class that the majority of our ninth graders take
- **Honors English 9**
  - This curriculum is more challenging in the areas of reading, writing, and discussion. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade English teacher should be consulted to see if the student is a good candidate for this class. Check your high school's website to see if there is required reading for this class.

## Science Options

- **Biology** is a required course for high school graduation
  - The majority of our students take Biology in 9<sup>th</sup> grade
- **Honors Biology** is also available
  - Ask your science teacher if this would be a good fit for you
- **Earth Science Essentials** is a required course for high school graduation
  - This course should be taken in 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> grade
- **Physics Essentials** meets the high school requirement for Physics
  - Students who plan to take advanced classes in Physics later in High School DO NOT need the Essentials course
  - Physics Essentials can only be taken in 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade

## Math Options

- Your high school counselor will be entering your math placement based on the math placement letter you received
- If you and your parent do not agree with the results, contact your middle school counselor for a recommendation override form

## Social Studies and Physical Education

## World Language Requirement

- Beginning with the class of 2016, all students must complete two credits of the same World Language.
- Students who wish to take **Level 1** of a language in 9<sup>th</sup> grade should have at least a “C” in their regular Language Arts class. The choices are:
  - French I      Japanese I      Arabic I
  - Spanish I      German I
- Students who wish to continue with **Level 2** of the language they took in 8<sup>th</sup> grade should have “A” or “B” grades all three terms
