

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE MME

MME Testing Dates for the Class of 2010 and selected Seniors who are eligible to retest

February 25, 2009: Pre-grid for ACT/MME during delayed start from 7:35-9:30 a.m.

March 10, 2009: ACT + Writing (No school for all other students)

March 11, 2009: ACT WorkKeys (Delayed Start for all other students)

March 12, 2009: MI Math, Science, and Social Studies (Delayed Start for all other students)

Do you know that you can take the ACT for free? Beginning with the class of 2008, MEAP was replaced by the Michigan Merit Exam (MME). The MME consists of ACT plus Writing, Work Keys (Applied Math, Reading for Information, and Locating Information), Michigan Math, Science, and Social Studies. The MME is a *mandatory* assessment for all Juniors throughout Michigan. What's in it for students who take the MME? Students receive a free college-reportable ACT score. A National Career Readiness Certificate is also available to students. They will also receive a \$4,000 scholarship if they participate in all three days of testing (how it is disbursed may differ depending on their score).
