Reconfirmation Meeting for October 20, 2020

Reconfirm instructional delivery method:

Grades K-5

Farmington Public Schools will continue with Learning at a Distance (full remote) through November 6, 2020, as we transition to an AM/PM Hybrid Schedule with the option for families to remain in Learning at a Distance (full remote) on November 9, 2020. The Farmington Public School Board of Education took action on this on October 6, 2020.

Grade 6-12

Farmington Public Schools will continue with Learning at a Distance (full remote) through January 25, 2020.

Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level:

Pre- Kindergarten: Pre-K will continue with in-person programming for Head Start, Great Start Readiness, and Tuition programming at lower class size.

Early Childhood Special Education Classes will continue with an every other day Hybrid Schedule with an option for families to remain in Learning at a Distance.

Elementary (Grades K - 5): Learning at a Distance (full remote) with opportunities for synchronous and asynchronous learning experiences will continue through November 6, 2020. The instructional model will transition to an AM/PM Hybrid Schedule starting November 9, 2020, with an option for students to stay in Learning at a Distance.

Middle School (Grades 6 - 8): Learning at a Distance (full remote) with opportunities for synchronous and asynchronous learning experiences through January 25, 2020

High School (Grades 9 - 12): Learning at a Distance (full remote) with opportunities for synchronous and asynchronous learning experiences through January 25, 2020

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

Special Education

Farmington Public Schools continues to transition special education populations to in-person instruction based on their needs while the district is fully remote.

Special education continues to offer support to SE students engaged in full remote learning.

As Farmington moves forward with its K-5 AM/PM Hybrid Learning Schedule, Special education is building in additional in-person learning opportunities based on student needs.

English Language Learners

English Language Learners continue to be supported by ESL staff as they engage in full remote learning.

As Farmington moves forward with its K-5 AM/PM Hybrid Learning Schedule, we are building in additional in-person learning opportunities for English Language Learners based on student needs.
